



Freedom Principle MO Announces Reschedule Date for St. Louis City Town Hall to Discuss “Building a Better, Safer St. Louis City”

The Freedom Principle MO is announcing a new date for the St. Louis City Town Hall. The new date will be Thursday, February 22, 2024, at the St. Louis Police Officers’ Association headquarters. The town hall “Building a Better, Safer St. Louis City” is an opportunity to meet with legislators and learn about the bills being proposed to address the challenges facing St. Louis City. “We are grateful to the St. Louis Police Officers’ Association for hosting this town hall and we appreciate all the legislators being able to adjust their busy schedules to participate,” said Byron Keelin, President Freedom Principle MO.

The town hall will be on Thursday, February 22, 2024, at St. Louis Police Officers’ Association, 3710 Hampton Avenue, St. Louis, MO 63109. The town hall will be from 6:30 pm – 8:30 pm, with doors opening at 5:30 pm. The issues the town hall will address include control of the St. Louis City police, reporting of St. Louis crime statistics, the homeless crisis, the earnings tax, economic development, crimes committed by minors, and other issues impacting St. Louis City residents.

The Town Hall will feature a bipartisan panel of legislators and will be moderated by Newstalk STL host and former Missouri Speaker of the House of Representatives Tim Jones. The panelists include Senator Bill Eigel (Dist. 23), Senator Nick Schroer (Dist. 2), Representative Justin Sparks (Dist. 110), Representative Jim Murphy (Dist. 94), and Representative Steve Butz (Dist. 81). The other invited panelists include Senator Steve Roberts (Dist. 5) and Representative Donna Baringer (Dist. 82).

“We are pleased to make this a bi-partisan effort as many of the bills that are being proposed will need bipartisan support to be passed,” said Keelin. “We are also glad to partner with Newstalk STL for this town hall. Newstalk STL has been a very important strategic partner in helping the Freedom Principle MO increase awareness of these issues in St. Louis City and Jefferson City.”

Attendees will be able to submit their questions in writing or if they are unable to attend in person but want to ask a question, they can submit their questions online by visiting www.freedomprinciplemo.org and clicking on the Submit Question button. “We are trying to give residents every opportunity to ask legislators about issues impacting their neighborhoods,” said Keelin.
