The Freedom Principle MO is excited to announce it will be sponsoring a St. Louis City Town Hall on Friday, January 12, 2024, at Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church. The town hall “Building a Better, Safer

St. Louis City” is an opportunity to meet with legislators and learn about the bills being proposed in the legislature to address the challenges facing St. Louis City. “The Freedom Principle MO has been asked by several St. Louis City Neighborhood Associations who are extremely frustrated by the policies coming from the St. Louis Mayor and the Board of Aldermen,” said Byron Keelin, President of the Freedom Principle MO. “Many bills have been introduced in the legislature to help St. Louis City. We want to give residents to hear what legislators are proposing and how these bills could impact them.

The Town Hall will feature a bipartisan panel of legislators and will be moderated by Newstalk STL host and former Missouri Speaker of the House of Representatives Tim Jones. The confirmed panelists include Senator Bill Eigel (Dist. 23), Representative Justin Sparks (Dist. 110), Representative Jim Murphy (Dist. 94), and Representative Steve Butz (Dist. 81). The other invited panelists include Senator Nick Schroer (Dist. 2) and Senator Karla May (Dist. 4). “We are pleased to make this a bi-partisan effort as many of the bills that are being proposed will need bipartisan support to be passed,” said Keelin. “We are also glad to partner with Newstalk STL for this town hall. Newstalk STL has been a very important strategic partner in helping the Freedom Principle MO increase awareness of these issues in St. Louis City and Jefferson City.”

The town hall will be on Friday, January 12, 2024, at Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church, 4092 Blow Street, St. Louis, MO. The town hall will be from 6:30 pm – 8:30 pm, with doors opening at 5:30 pm. The issues the town hall will address include control of the St. Louis City police, reporting of St. Louis crime statistics, the homeless crisis, the earnings tax, economic development, crimes committed by minors, and other issues impacting St. Louis City residents.

Attendees will be able to submit their questions in writing or if they are unable to attend in person but want to ask a question, they can submit their questions online by visiting www.freedomprinciplemo.org and clicking on the Submit Question button. “We are trying to give residents every opportunity to ask legislators about issues impacting their neighborhoods,” said Keelin.
